GENERAL BUSINESS

Financial Year

Aaron raised that the AGM's timing did not marry up with the playing year, the Club's financial year nor the WHA's financial year. He thought that moving the AGM to later in the year would ensure the AGM better reflected the playing year, that the accounts would reflect the whole year's income from subs and, the Club's running costs for that year. The Constitution does not allow for such a significant change to be made to clauses of the Constitution with the amendments being placed in front of the members and being voted on at an AGM or SGM (Special General Meeting). With this in mind Allyson Gofton moved that:

The incoming Committee to review the dates for the AGM and financial year as set down in the Constitution and that they will establish dates that better suit the Club's business. The Club will call a SGM no later than the 31st August 2021, to vote on the necessary changes to the Constitution.

Clauses to be affected in the Club's Constitution are, **Finance** paragraph 13.5 and **General Meetings** paragraph 15.1.

- Truman Wee suggested that given the amount of interest in this suggestion that the best
 way to move this idea and proposal forward, would be to establish an honours
 committee who would review all present and past members and, that any awards be
 awarded at a special Club event.

With animated discussion showing great interest in the idea, Aaron Barnsdall moved that:

The incoming Committee to pick up the idea of establishing an honours committee with a clear brief of its role, and for that sub-committee to begin with the above names and review these and any others who should be recognised, at what level and in what way.

Gilby-Todd Trophy

Truman Wee spoke of the significance of the association of the Club with the Gilby-Todd Trophy, as newer members were not aware of Ben Gilby-Todd. Ben, a member of both SPHC and University Hockey clubs, was tragically killed in an accident in 2009. He played rep-hockey and also played in the UK. The family established a trust, to help budding young players financially and, also the Gilby-Todd Cup. The Cup was to be a one-off game, played annually between SPHC & University Prem Men's teams. In recent years the Cup has not been played for. The AGM attendees all agreed that this Cup challenge <u>must</u> continue and asked that the incoming committee to re-establish the Gilby-Todd Cup as a major event in the Club's playing calendar. Aaron to send Allyson an email with further details and Allyson to add this to the next committee meeting's agenda.

With there being no further business, the SPHC 2021 AGM was closed at 7.30pm.

Suburbs-Piako Hockey Club - Chairman's Report

Wednesday 14th of March 2021

To the club members and committee members with interests in the Suburbs-Piako Hockey Club. Please accept this chairman's report for the financial year 2020-2021. To be tabled at the next Annual General Meeting, on the 14th of April 2021.

For the 2020 season, the club ended the year with six teams, which consisted of five men's teams and one women's team.

2021 sees a completely different situation. Where we have grown two more teams. And now operate with two women's and six men's teams.

This equates to approximately 128 players, and close to equal numbers we had at a stage when we had three women's teams, and five men's teams five years ago. An idea is for our club to achieve six men's and six women's teams, to solidify our senior hockey, and reach all levels and abilities of a senior player.

2020 was interrupted by a pandemic COVID-19. Which was a huge disruption to the season. Our club being more proactive in 2019 planned very well for 2020 and was able to select players and get teams on the field before the pandemic started. Whilst the season was played with interruption, players played with passion and resilience on return from the lock down.

Our committee was very resilient last year. And planned very well in lock down. I can't question that, and we certainly used our virtual platforms to reach each other.

On reflection of the efforts of last year I would like to thank the following people.

Allyson Gofton as secretary and her above and beyond attitude, that is highly appreciated. It has certainly been a pleasure to work alongside her. We have had many phone calls, about opportunity and funding. Which has resulted in our successful applications.

Rob has also given great service in coaching and management, when we went through a long period of doubt around our women's hockey at the club. As we look to the future, I hope to see more growth at the club, through hard work at both the committee and the membership level.
